If he isn't seriously injured with a rib injury he sustained in the fourth quarter (and from recent reports, it appears that he just had the wind knocked out of him), he may be worth a look. He had 14 carries for 78 yards before going out, ultimately out working previous starter Daryl Richardson, who had 13 carriesfor only 48 yards. He didn't look particularly shifty, but when Sam Bradford was rolling, linebackers stood back giving the Rams some room to run. Stacy was the most effective back in the Ram's stables, but Bradford won't always be good and there's an injury risk here. But Rams' coach Jeff Fisher confirmed that Stacy will remain the starter in St. Louis, and if you want to take a flyer in 14-team or deeper leagues, there are worse bets.

Andre Ellington - RB - 22% Owned

It's not sexy playing for the Cardinals nowadays. And it hasn't been since the time of Kurt Warner. But there have been some versatile weapons in Arizona that might just be worth a gamble. And Andre Ellington is one of them. He doesn't get many touches, but between carries and receptions, he's had at least 6total touches in each of the last 4 games, and has been very efficient with them. This week he had 7 carries for 52 yards and four receptions for 31 yards. True, he only had one TD on the season and the Cardinals don't score much, but if you need yards, make no mistake, Ellington can get them. And he's been much better on a yards per carry average than running mateRashard Mendenhall (though Mendenhall got the TD against the Panthers). Either way, need a bye week desperation fill in in 14-team or deeper leagues, or perhaps a flex in 16-team or deeper leagues? Ellington is your man. And if his touches continue to trend up, then he just might sneak into 12-team territory.

Terrance Williams - WR - 15% Owned

Miles Austin won't be injured forever, and Tony Romo won't always be as on target as he was against the suddenly vulnerable Denver defense. But Terrance Williams was 7 for 8 for 71 yards last week (which I mentioned as a bonus pick up last week), showing he had Romo's attention. And this week, he did way more than that with 151 yards and 2 TDs. Sounds like what he did when he was at Baylor, doesn't it? The problem is that he only had four targets, but at least he converted all of them. He'll be boom or bust, and it will be hard to predict when he'll go off, but you could do worse for a bye week fill in in 12-team and deeper leagues, or 4th WR in 14-team and deeper leagues, as long as Miles Austin remains out.

Rueben Randle - WR - 37% Owned

The Giants aren't a good team. Let's face it, Eli Manning is having some timing problems, vision problems, or both. And he's going to keep throwing interceptions and missing receivers. But at the end of the day, junk time points count as much as regular points in fantasy football, so all we care about is that the Giants will be playing from behind, a lot, and thus they'll have to throw a lot. And it looks like defenses will key on Victor Cruz, leaving a little room for Hakeem Nicks, and apparently a good amount of room for Rueben Randle. Randle has good raw skills, but hasn't had an opportunity to show it until now. He won't be consistent, but over the first four games, he's had 23 targets. And against the Eagles, he had 6 receptions for 96 yards and his first 2 TDs of the season. He won't be scoring tons of TDs, but it's not unforeseeable that he might get 5-7 targets per game and convert most of them for 70-90 yards. Not too shabby as a third WR in 14-team or deeper leagues, or a flex or bye week replacement in 12-team or deeper leagues.

Austin Pettis - WR - 10% Owned

Here's another flyer. Sam Bradford likes to spread it around, but he's on pace for over 4000 passing yards, so even if you split that up amongst his receivers, some of them have to go to Austin Pettis. And as of now he's getting his fair share of targets and his fair share of touchdowns with four of them over his last four games. Of course, 2 of them were against the Jaguars, but hey, they all count the same don't they? If the Rams can't get their ground game going, they'll continue going to the air. Worth a look as a bye week fill in or possible flex in 14-team or deeper leagues.

You really hurtin' in those 16-team or deeper leagues? Here's a flyer for you. Kris Durham has had increasing targets every week, from 2, to 3, to 4 to 8 against the Packers. Of course,Megatron was out of the game, but he may be out next week as well, and hey, you never know, do you? Durham only caught 3 of his 8 targets today, but at least it included a touchdown. He'll get better if he needs to keep starting, and those in very deep leagues might be able to use his services as a bye week fill in, flex, or 3rd/4th WR, assuming Megatron remains sidelined.

And here's a list of pick ups mentioned in previous weeks that I still recommend picking up if they're still available: *Nate Washington, DeAndre Hopkins, Bernard Pierce, Fred Jackson, Brian Hartline, Joique Bell, Julian Edelman, Roy Helu Jr., Terrelle Pryor and Rashad Jennings.*

So cut bait on those name value players! But don't cut bait on Wonder Woman. Anyone who's so confident that all they need are two armored bracelets to deflect bullets is too cool to be cut.
